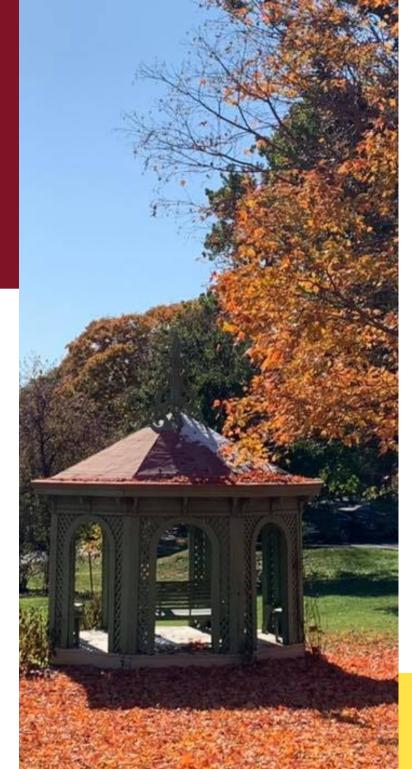

National Travel Industry

1. Holiday Travel

The steady decline of COVID 19 across the country will spur lots of family-related travel this fall and winter with 7 in 10 holiday travelers planning to spend time with friends and family. This is good news since visiting F&F is typically the number one reason to travel to cities and states throughout the U.S.

2. **Staffing Shortages**

Business owners fear venues will have to significantly reduce capacities if hires cannot be made. There are 335,000+ less people employed in the hospitality industry compared to last year. Many are considering hybrid working models with scheduling flexibility to retain and recruit employees.

3. International Inbound Travel

At air, land and sea ports of entry, and across destinations nationwide, the U.S. travel industry will welcome all vaccinated international visitors back to the U.S. after 19 long months of pandemic related border restrictions beginning Monday, November 8, 2021. International travel produced \$239 billion in export income in 2019, and directly supported 1.2 million American jobs.

Kansas Tourism

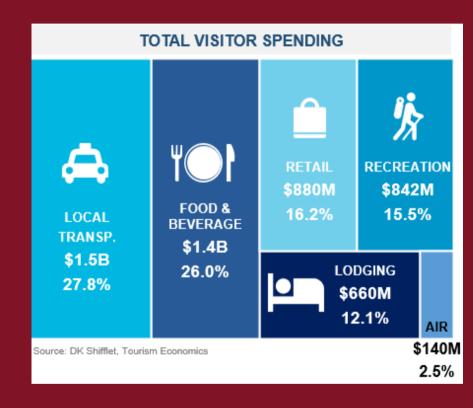


In 2020, 31.4 million visitors spent \$5.4 billion dollars in Kansas.

Jobs supported by visitor spending are 4.3% of all jobs in Kansas.

Due to the pandemic visitor spending fell by more than a quarter in 2020, amounting to a decline of \$1.9 billion.

Visitors generated \$589 million in state and local taxes, which is equivalent to \$520 in tax savings to every household in Kansas.

In 2020, tourism was the 12th largest employer in Kansas

Visitor activity directly supported 53,442 jobs in Kansas in 2020. Comparing this with the direct employment in other industry sectors, tourism would rank as the 12th largest industry.

In 2019, tourism ranked 9th.

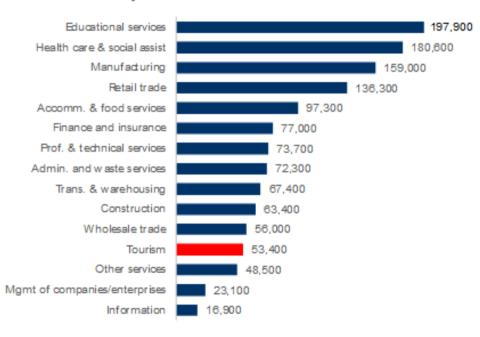
THE NUMBER OF JOBS DIRECTLY SUPPORTED BY TOURISM FELL BY NEARLY 12,600 JOBS, A DECLINE OF OVER 19%.

DIRECT TOURISM EMPLOYMENT HAS FALLEN BACK TO LEVELS SEEN IN THE 2009 RECESSION.

BUT, EVEN IN THE THROES OF A PANDEMIC, VISITOR SPENDING SUPPORTED 53,442 JOBS, REPRESENTING 2.9% OF ALL JOBS IN KANSAS. EVEN IN THE PANDEMIC, WITH TOURISM SIGNIFICANTLY AFFECTED, ONE OUT OF EVERY 35 JOBS IN KANSAS WAS DIRECTLY SUPPORTED BY VISITOR SPENDING.

Employment in Kansas, by major industry

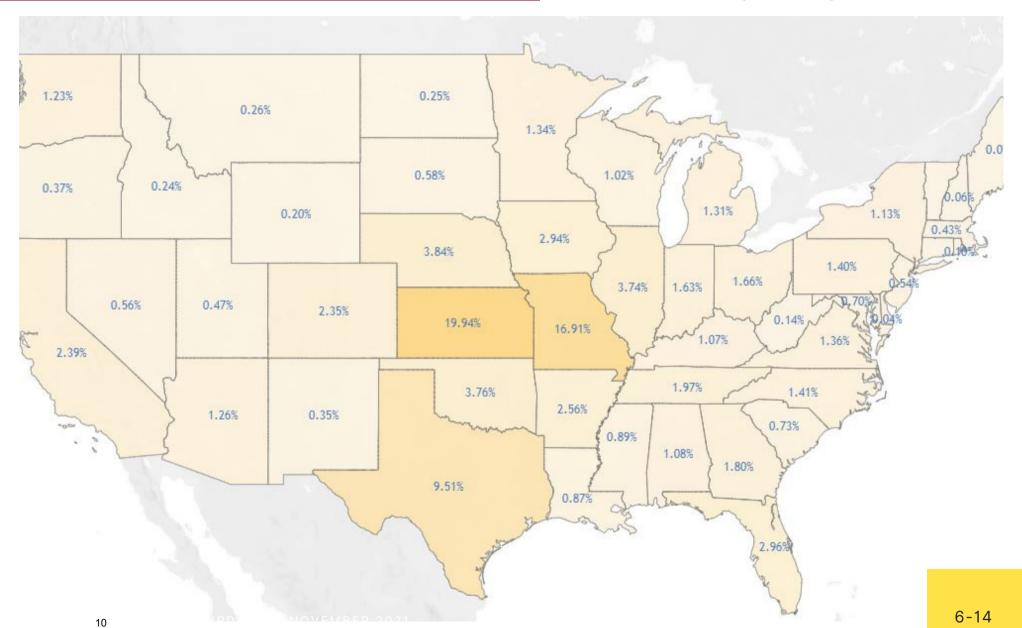
Amounts in number of jobs
